The profest cause of Erasmus leaving England about this time, was to attend the Press at Basil, where he chose to have his Books publish'd under the care of Froben the Printer. In the preceeding Year we have an Epistle indeed of his to Gonell' dated in 1515. in words at length in the London Edition, and yet the matter determines it to have been in the former Year. For in the beginning of July 1514. he was got over to Hamme Castle near Calice. from whence he wrote to Servatius that he had not left England, for want of encouragement; for the King, and Bishop Wolley his prime favourite, had promis'd him mighty matters: but he must go to Basil to publish his Lucubrations. Upon the same 8th of July 1514. he wrote to his Friend And. Ammonius. in London, gave him an account of his fafe Voyage, that however he had the misfortune of
